As we continue our 2024 journey in #celebratingeverychild, we are proud of how Tampines Primary has been building the value of 'excellence' in every student. We view excellence as essential for personal growth and success and we believe it is supported by the values of teamwork and appreciation.

### The Importance of Teamwork

Teamwork at Tampines Primary goes beyond simply working together. It's about combining strengths, respecting differences and supporting one another to achieve shared goals. Collaborative group work is integral to daily classroom activities. Students are assigned specific roles such as leader, time manager and presenter, ensuring everyone plays an active part. This approach not only fosters teamwork but also encourages peer support, both academically and socially.

During PAL lessons and CCAs, team-building exercises reinforce the significance of every team member's role. Events like the Senior and Junior Olympics help students develop skills in teamwork and sportsmanship. These are not just athletic competitions but opportunities for students to build bonds, character and mutual respect.

Our teachers model teamwork in their interactions, demonstrating how collaboration and respect can lead to success and encouraging students to do the same in their relationships.

### Fostering Appreciation

Appreciation is a simple but powerful way to create a positive environment. We actively promote this through our #celebratingeverychild initiative by encouraging students to recognise and celebrate each other's efforts. Peer reflection and self-reflection during lessons help students appreciate their growth in areas such as academics, friendships and personal development.

Students are also encouraged to express gratitude regularly. Each morning, they joyfully greet each other and staff and at the end of lessons, they thank their teachers. This practice helps students see the positives in every situation and builds a supportive community.

Our Values-in-Action project has seen P1 students showing appreciation for our canteen staff through thank-you notes, while our I&E (Innovation & Enterprise) monitors have demonstrated care for seniors at St Luke's Eldercare Centre, fostering intergenerational connections. These simple gestures remind us of the importance of empathy in strengthening our school community.

In addition, our Community Theatre production 'The Invisible Backpack' sparked meaningful conversations about mental health and anti-bullying. Through this performance, our students highlighted the emotional burdens their friends may carry, inspiring care and understanding in our daily interactions.

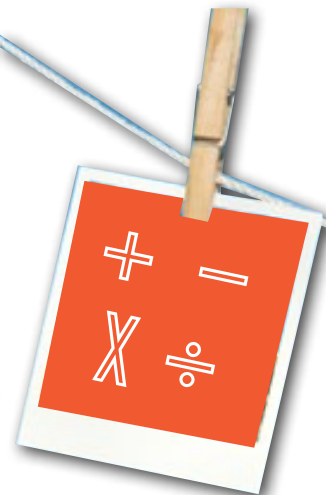
# P1 Learning Journey to Zoo

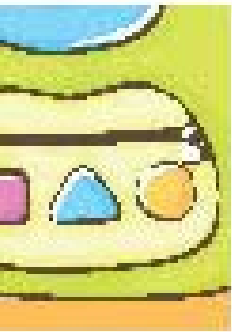
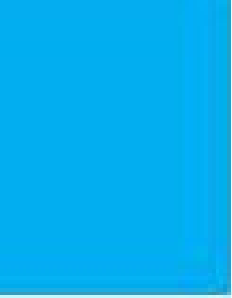
# P26 Sungei Buloh



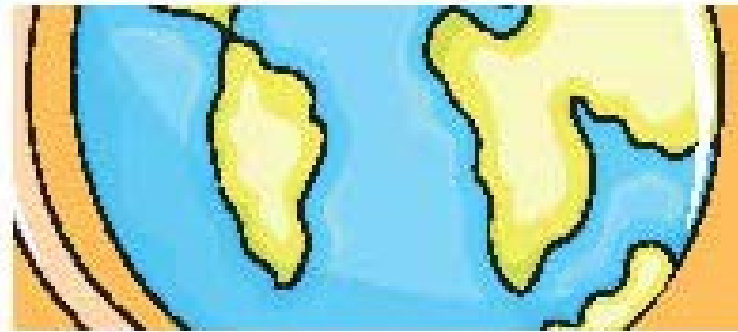

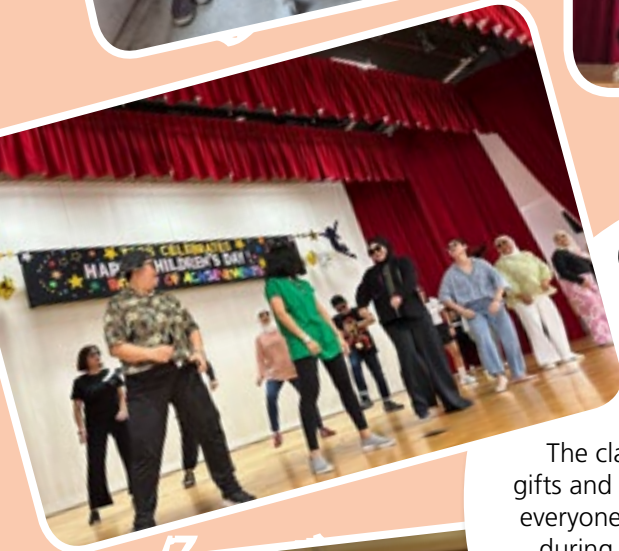
# Teachers' Day

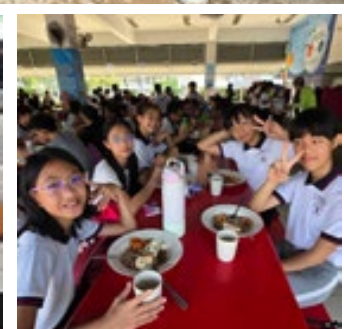
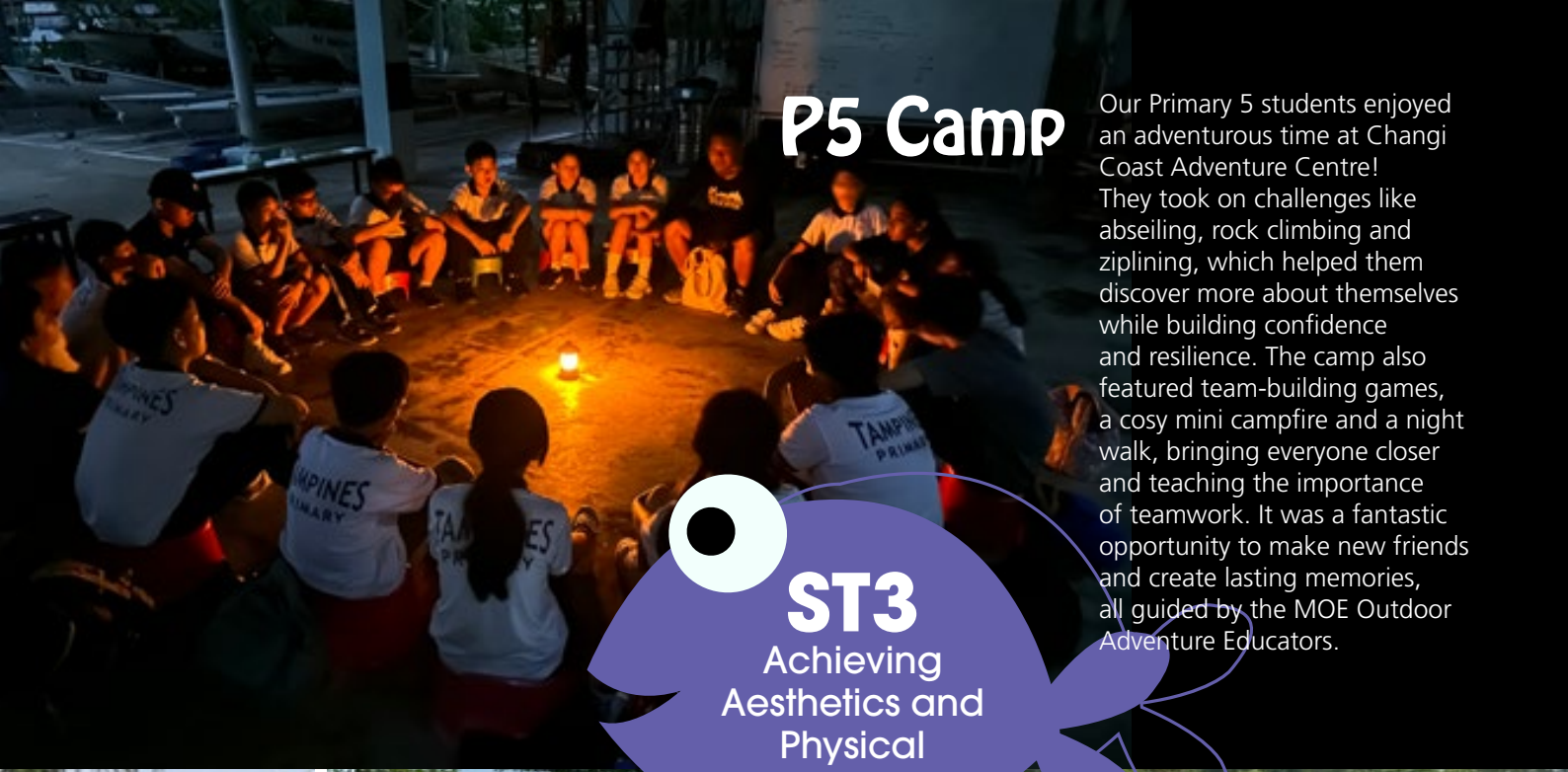




# P5 Camp
