### **Revision to Canteen Prices**

The school has been working closely with the canteen stallholders to maintain their prices for school meals. However, due to the increase in operating costs, there will be a revision in September. A healthy meal will cost about \$1.50 to \$1.80, with a piece of fruit. For students who need to have larger portions, the meal will cost about \$2 to \$2.20. We would like to reassure parents that the team led by Mr John Ng, Vice Principal (Admin), will oversee this and our aim will be to keep prices affordable whilst ensuring that the meals meet the healthy plate guidelines set by the Health Promotion Board. This price revision will take place in Term 4, after the September holidays.

As we celebrate National Day 2022, the call of "Stronger Together, Majulah!" is for all of us to forge ahead towards a better future as we emerge from COVID-19.
