PSLE LISTENING COMPREHENSION (LC) EXAMINATION - 16 SEP

As part of TPPS continued efforts to safeguard the safety and well-being of students and staff, a series of enhanced Safe Management Measures (SMMs) have been put in place for the 2022 national examinations that could be subjected to changes according to the national posture. Please check with your child's form teacher if you have any queries.

PSLE Listening Comprehension Examination for P6 will be this Friday, 16 September.

P1 to P5 students do not report to school on that day. They will be doing Home Based Learning (HBL) for the day.

P6 are to report to school punctually at 7.45 a.m. and assemble in the hall. For students who are exempted from Mother Tongue Languages (MTL), they will report at 10 a.m. in the hall.

PSLE WRITTEN EXAMINATION - 29 SEPTEMBER TO 5 OCTOBER

STUDY BREAK BEFORE PSLE - 26 TO 28 SEPTEMBER (MONDAY TO WEDNESDAY)

The PSLE Written Examinations are from 29 September to 5 October. P6 students are to report punctually to school at the usual reporting time. They will be dismissed from school at the end of each paper. Please refer to the PSLE Examinations booklet sent out in May for specific dismissal timing.

P1 to 5 students will attend school as usual

Similar to 2021, MOE will implement a study break for all P6 cohorts **from 26 September (Monday) to 28 September (Wednesday).** This is aimed to support student well-being and to minimise the risks of school-based transmission prior to the PSLE. All P6 students are strongly encouraged to remain at home. P6 teachers will provide the necessary support and targeted consultation for all P6 students. P6 parents will receive more details via a separate memo.

This is also a period of year-end assessments for P3 – P6 students.
